## Monitoring Well Project Going Strong!

Phase one of the DFC Monitoring Well program is wrapping up. Geoprojects International has drilled 4 wells so far and is working on the 5<sup>th</sup> well now. GCGCD and GCUWCD are working with the project consulting geologists, reviewing the pumping data and compiling the reports.

Phase two will include additional wells in Guadalupe, Gonzales and Caldwell Counties.

It's time again to start re-evaluating current MAG distributions and begin GAM simulations for the Desired Futured Conditions checklist. GMA 13 will be working with LRE Water over the next few years through this joint planning process. As TWDB works to update its model, our multi-district project continues to gather data in efforts to support those much-needed updates.

We are so excited to have completed Phase 1 of the DFC Monitoring Well Project and look forward to completing three additional wells in Guadalupe County. We were fortunate enough to have drilled a monitor well adjacent to one of our weather station sites. So GCGCD has once again partnered with TexMesonet to incorporate water level readings from that well with one of the weather station sites. Stay tuned for updates as we get that system on line! A special *thank you* to everyone involved in this project!



To date our annual rainfall totals are below expected average for 2019



## DFC Monitoring Wells

GCGCD continues to drill wells in the outcrop of the Carrizo aquifer to gather data in support of the adopted Desired Future Conditions (75% of saturated thickness in the outcrop at the end of 2012 remains in 2070). Data collected from this project will be shared with the TWDB for future updates to groundwater models which are used to determine water availability across regions. GCGCD now has three new monitoring wells in place and two new wells have been drilled in Gonzales County.
